There is common agreement about the importance of raising outcomes in communication and language as they have direct impact on future learning across the curriculum.</p> <p>EYPP children have been targeted for Welcomm interventions and well as Talking Tables.</p> <p>Children in receipt of EYPP are achieving well and are outperforming cohort averages across all areas except creative Expressive Arts and Design. 75% of EYPP children were at or above the expected level for communication and language compared to 63% of the entire cohort.</p>
